

OVERALL INCIDENT OBJECTIVES

1. Provide for the health, safety, and welfare of all personnel working around the incident.
2. Provide for the recovery and identification of as many remains as possible, and return to the family.
3. Coordinate with all involved agencies to support the operational needs of the incident.
4. Document all critical items and significant events.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

1. Recovery operations continue on a 24-hour basis.
2. Slurry Wall Tiebacks continue.

CONTINUING ACTIONS

1. Operations continue on debris removal from the Northwest pit area.
2. Debris removal from WTC 2 and WTC 6 continues.
3. Welding, debris removal, and shoring operations @ Bankers Trust (130 Liberty St.) continues. Sprinkler system is still OOS. Standpipe system has been filled. The manual fire pump is functional, the automatic pump is not in service.
4. Debris removal from WTC 6 continues. Hand line fire prevention/suppression support from FDNY required on Vesey St. as necessary.
5. NYDOL PESH issuing personal monitoring for PD & FD.
6. Additional evacuation stairs have been added. This should reduce pedestrian traffic on access road.
7. Standpipe at 90 West Street is partially OOS and is presently dry. FD can supply the Siamese on West St only. Contractor will forward a report each day on number of workers and what floor they are working on.

PLANNED ACTIONS (Next 24 hours)


1. Debris removal and shoring at 130 Liberty St., Bankers Trust., is ongoing. The 2 service elevators located on the south side are in service with phase 1 and phase 2 of Fireman Service working.
2. Core Drilling and Tie Backs continue. Grouting of slurry walls ongoing.
3. Shoring at South Projection on going.

ANTICIPATED ACTIONS

1. Equipment scheduled to be removed from the chiller room in the northwest pit area. A 150-foot exclusion zone will be maintained at all times. SCBA will be pre-positioned outside the exclusion zone for use by FDNY members if needed.
2. Removal of remaining debris from WTC #6 has begun. WEAPONS ARE STILL FOUND IN WTC#6, FDNY MEMBERS ARE PROHIBITED FROM HANDLING THESE WEAPONS. PAPD SHALL BE NOTIFIED FOR REMOVAL OF ANY WEAPONS RECOVERED.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **FDNY Sector Chiefs will approve all searches.**
2. **No open flames or warming fires. All fires will be extinguished by FDNY.**
3. **Operations Chief shall designate 3 Safety Chief per tour.**
4. **PPE requirements are as follows:**
 - Red Zone – Helmet, Safety Glasses & Safety Shoes, Coveralls, Long-sleeved Shirts.
 - Inner Zone – Helmet, Safety Glasses, Safety Shoes, Respirators, Coveralls & Long-sleeved Shirts. FD Helmets and turnout coats with reflective tape must be worn when working on the pile to identify as members of the dept.
5. **FDNY personnel parking is located on the south side of Warren St., 250 feet east of West St. Members will be issued a site access card at the beginning of their shift. These access cards must be prominently displayed to allow entry onto the site. The access cards shall be handed in at the end of the shift. Coveralls will be available at the FD Warren St. parking lot.**
6. **The Global Positioning System (GPS) is to be used to plot locations of all victims, remains, fire equipment and apparatus. If the GPS is not operational, hand held GPS operators will manually record grid locations using a **grid map dated 09/20 or later**. GPS units are available through the Sector Chiefs, who shall contact the GPS Team via channel 5.**
7. **When any undamaged SCBA or compressed gas cylinders are found, the Sector Chief will contact OCP for EPA notification.**
8. **Prior to any vehicles being removed/towed from buildings, FDNY Operations Chief must determine if a foam handline is needed.**
9. **A charged handline must be in position prior to any steel cutting operation inside of buildings.**
10. **All underground insertions/void searches must be coordinated with FDNY SOC Chief on duty and the ICP at Liberty St. (E-10/L-10) to ensure safety.**
11. **Operations Chief shall attend Contractors Meeting inside BOVIS Trailer, at 0800 and 1730 hours each day.**
12. **Teams should only operate where grapplers or other machinery are operating.**
13. **West Street Siamese at 3 WFC is OOS. Use Vesey Street Siamese if needed.**
14. **When valuable personal objects are found (necklace, watches, etc.) notify a chief officer who will document all pertinent information in the West Hut Journal. FD Operations command post shall notify NYPD and/or PAPD. Valuables shall be turned over to the responding Police Officer. The Police Officers Name and shield number shall be recorded.**
15. **WTC TASK FORCE COMMUNICATION CHANNEL IS NOW OPERATING ON CHANNEL #3.**
16. **READ ATTACHED SAFETY MESSAGE.**



SAFETY MESSAGE

Personal Protective Equipment

Personal Protective Equipment including respirators, FDNY Bunker coats and or reflective vests, FDNY Helmets, etc., are now mandatory on the site and will be checked by Safety Personnel. PPE is for your own protection. Get it, Wear it Use it.

Use the proper PPE, this includes FIRE DEPT HELMET, Fit Tested Respirators, and Adequate Eye and Ear Protection. *AVOID* the fumes created by cutting steel—Respirators are absolutely required when working in the pit, around steel cutters or down wind of cutting operations.

Be Prepared

Be prepared for the unexpected. Evaluate all tasks for hazards and take steps to mitigate them. Always be aware of working machinery and have an escape route planned in case of emergencies. Keep a safe distance from all Jersey Barriers and other Fall Protection devices.

Ear Protection

Noise levels throughout the site can reach high levels. With the presence of all the construction equipment and vehicles noise is everywhere. Members should be aware that the noise level at and around #6 WTC has been found to be exceptionally high. Members should use earplugs. Earplugs are available at the Cache located at 10/10. The tool cache is open daily from 7am-8pm. Respirators can be obtained from the OSHA.

Grappler / Excavator Operations

Be alert whenever cranes are working in your area. Look up and move away from within the crane's swing arc. Operators, avoid moving loads over personnel or populated facilities. Ensure all cranes are operating within safe limits, and all rigging operations are monitored for safety. Observe a **50' circle of danger** around grapplers and excavators. Be aware of moving Yuks with debris (most commonly rebar) hanging over the sides. Give moving Grapplers and Yuks plenty of room to pass.

Nothing Is Worth Getting Injured For--Take Care of Yourself. Remember everyone is a safety officer. If you see a hazard correct it or report it to your officer.

REQUIRE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

EMS Personnel are available and located onsite.

ALS 72-S is located at Church & Vesey 2 Paramedics

BLS 72-B is located at Albany & West 2 EMT's

BLS 71-A is located at Church & Cortland 2 EMT's

When required, EMS can flush and wash your eyes.

When required, EMS will transport member(s) to an Emergency Room.

Oxygen and Acetylene Cylinders

Oxygen and acetylene cylinders are still being found in the debris. When oxygen, acetylene, or propane cylinders are found, operations DC will be notified. SOC makes determination whether tanks are damaged or leaking and if Haz-Mat response is required. EPA will be called to pick up any non-leaking Oxygen, Acetylene, or propane cylinders. Reminder: An acetylene cylinder was punctured, ignited and burned for 12 hours. Several Scott cylinders have been punctured causing a violent escape of high pressure gas.

Scott cylinders still attached to 4.5 harness must go through the GPS system. Scott cylinders not attached to anything will be taken to FD shed at West and Liberty.

On-Site Transportation Vehicles

Any member requiring transportation from inside the site, shall use the Transportation Van. The use of ATV's and Gators transporting members over loading these vehicles is prohibited. On-Site speed limit for any vehicle is 10 MPH.

All Law Enforcement Agencies have been instructed to strictly regulate All Vehicle Traffic Laws. ATV's and GATORS must abide by these laws especially on WEST ST. and CHURCH ST.

ATV'S AND GATORS SHALL NOT DRIVE AGAINST THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC.
